Preface

This book is a genealogy and family history compiled from material gathered, from many sources, during my search for my ancestors and relatives that spans a period of over twenty years. I became interested in genealogy in the fall of 1973, when I read an article in a local newspaper stating that Rhoda Cross Sunderland was going to teach a class in genealogy at the Joslyn Adult Center in Burbank. My wife Catherine was also interested in her genealogy and family history. Catherine and I took this course and at the same time we started searching for and compiling information of our relatives and ancestors. Catherine has a very interesting genealogy and family history, but that is another story —another book.

After my retirement from the building and construction business in 1974, genealogy and family history research has been my main hobby.

All of my immigrant ancestors came from Germany and all settled in Ohio. All except two at some time during their lives resided in Mercer County. Wendelin and Theresia Koch settled and remained in Darke County. I was born in Mercer County, and spent the early years of my life there and in Auglaize County. I knew the area well and personally knew many of my relatives who lived in the area at that time, which was a big help to me in my research.

Over the years during my research I corresponded and visited with many relatives, friends and others who have contributed information to this genealogy and history. They are all cited and named in the footnotes and sources throughout this book. Their help was very much appreciated. To each and everyone of them my sincere thanks for your help.

In the German language some vowels are modified by the addition of an umlaut. In the English language these vowels are translated by adding an E/e after the vowel. In this book the English translation is used.

As my research progressed and I began finding more and more ancestors and relatives, a numbering system became a necessity in order to record them all in their proper places. It was then that I devised the system used in this book.

"To err is human; to forgive divine."
When errors are found, please be divine.

The Format and Numbering System

There are nine chapters, one for my ancestor chart and one for each of my immigrant ancestral families. Each family is recorded as follows.

ANCESTORS IN GERMANY: These are identified by a number as they appear on my Ancestor Chart or Ahnentafel. (This is the standard numbering system for this type of chart).

DESCENDANTS IN AMERICA: My ancestors have two numbers, their Ancestor Chart number followed by their identification number as explained below.

The book has two parts.

PART I The families on my fathers side:

NIEKAMP	- NI1000
KOCH	- KO1000
BUEHLER	- BU1000
STAMMEN	- ST1000

PART II The families on my mothers side:

GIESEKE	- GI1000
DICKE	- DI1000

The Identification numbers start with the eldest immigrant ancestor. The letters are the first two letters of the surname or family name. The first number after the surname letters is the generation number counting forward from the immigrant ancestor. The next number is that persons identification number within that generation.

In a marriage between two persons of the eight families recorded in this book each keeps his or her identification number when they marry. Otherwise: the wife takes her husbands's number which is followed by W1 if she is the first wife, W2 if she is his second wife etc.. The husband takes his wife's number which is followed by H1 if he is her first husband, H2 if he is her second husband etc.. Listed with these spouses are their parents when known.

An asterisk * following a person's identification number indicates that this person marries and carries on as a family unit and is recorded in the next generation. Marriages or family units not researched and where there was little information found or available are not carried on to the next generation.



Chapter Two

Piekamp Family

Mickamp Family Homeland

ur Immigrant Niekamp ancestors came from Essen in Oldenburg, (today Lower Saxony or Niederschsen), Germany. The family of Johann Henrich Niekamp and his wife Catherina Margareta Mormann are the first and only Niekamps recorded in the Churchbooks of St. Bartholomaus Catholic Church in Essen at that time. The first entry is the baptism of their fifth child Anna Marie Catherina on 26 Sep 1807. They came into the area then, sometime between 1800 and 1807. The surnames Niekamp and Mormann are both indigenous to the area therefore the ancestors of these families probably came from places not far from Essen.

Essen's business interests lie chiefly in agriculture. The surrounding area is nearly all farmland. Total land area within the community is about 25,000 acres; by comparsion it is just a little larger than Marion Township, Mercer County, Ohio, where the Fred Niekamp family settled. About 21,000 acres is farmland, 1800 acres woodland, 700 acres residential, 100 acres marshland, 90 acres industrial, and the rest is vacant or waste land.

People were already living in the area of Essen, in the early Stone Age and during the Bronze and Iron Age. Findings dug up and excavations of the burial mounds attest to this. The village was founded in the year 968; at this time they built a Basilica to honor the holy Pankratius. Sometime between the years 1175-86 Simon, Graf von Teklenburg founded the Benedictine Monastery in Essen. It burned down in 1194 and was rebuilt in Malgarten about 20 to 25 miles south of Essen towards Osnabruck. In the year 1286 is the first mention of a court of law in Essen.

In the year 1570 the community became Lutheran. A fire in 1601 destroyed the church and school; only the church was rebuilt. In 1613 the last Lutheran pastor Johann Molan was relieved of his duties, and Catholicism was introduced by Dr. Hartmann.

During the Thirty Years War (1618-1648) the community was almost completely destroyed, twenty farms were devastated, poverty and illnesses reigned. In 1651 there are only 685 residents in the once prosperous community; in that same year they changed the patron name of the church from St. Pankratius to St. Bartholomaus. After the end of the thirty years war the little community started to pull together and prosper again. In 1703 the count was already 3000 residents. Essen continues to grow; the population in 1982 was 6742 residents.

Miekamp Family in America

mmigrant ancestor Johan Gerd Frederick Niekamp was born in or near Essen in the Grandduchy of Oldenburg, Germany, on 9 Apr 1811, the son of Johann Henrich Niekamp and Catherine Margarethe Mormann; he was baptized 11 Apr 1811 in St. Bartholomaus Catholic Church in Essen.

In 1833 at age 22 he came to America, a ship's passenger record of him has not been found, but I believe he came through the port of Baltimore. He went first to Cincinnati, Ohio where he stayed a short time, then to Tippecanoe, founded in 1840 (the name was later changed to Tipp City), where he assisted in hauling logs for the first houses built there.

He was married to Catherine Maria Niehauss on 3 Mar 1840 by Rev. Damian Juncker in Emmanuel Catholic Church, Dayton, Ohio. After their marriage they resided in Monroe Township, Miami County. In the same year on 10 Aug 1840 he became a naturalized citizen of the United States. They had three sons John, Joseph and Clemmens when they moved to Mercer County, Ohio in 1848.

On 19 Feb 1848 Frederick bought from Samuel and Elisa Gray, for the sum of \$600.00, 80 acres of land, and on 27 May from Cornelius and Lavina Stocker, for the sum of \$300.00, 40 adjoining acres, both located in Sec. 10, in Marion Township, Mercer County. There is a family legend, that he traded a surrey (a light carriage) for one of these parcels, there is no mention of this in the deeds, but might have been a part of the bargain. This was all wilderness at that time except for seven acres that had been cleared.

He built first a log house with a loft which he replaced in 1872 with a large 2 story brick residence. They were one of the first German families to settle in Marion Township. Frederick was one of the few in the township at that time who could speak English, and frequently accompanied German neighbors when they went to Celina to settle legal or business matters.

A daughter Mary was born on 27 Jul 1849. Three years later on 26 Sep 1852 wife and mother Catherine died. The record at St. John Catholic Church, Maria Stein, reads "Maria Catherina Niecamp died with the Sacraments on Sep. 26, 1852". She was buried in St. John Church Cemetery.

The following year on 19 Apr 1853 Frederick and Anna Catherine Stammen were married by the Rev. Aloysius Schelbert in St. John Catholic Church. She was the daughter of Albert and Wilhelmina Stammen and immigrated with her parents from Germany in 1850. The Stammen family went directly to Mercer County where they settled on a parcel of land Albert bought on 2 Jul 1850; it was adjoining to and just across the road from the Niekamp farm.

Frederick and Anna Catherine were pioneer members of St. Sebastian Parish, and helped build the first two churches, the first in 1852/53, and the second, larger church in 1878, both were built on the same site, on the six acres of land which was donated to John

Purcell, the Archbishop of Cincinnati by Anna Catherine's parents.

To Frederick and Anna Catherine were born ten children, five died young and five lived to maturity. Henry A. (my grandfather) was the first born, then a daughter Philomena, and three sons Gerhard, Peter and Frank. In February 1880, Frederick's son Clemmens and his wife Maria Catherine Lindhaus died, leaving two children Frank Jr. and Anna both under five years of age. The grandparents then took them into their home and raised them as their own.

All the children continued to live on the farm with their parents until each in turn married and made their homes on nearby or neighboring farms. Their son Peter married Frances Bertke on 25 Sep 1883, the young couple made their home on the farm with Peter's parents. On 6 May 1887 Frederick deeded the farm to Peter, and the parents continued to live there with them, being well taken care of by Peter and Frances. Frederick and Anna Catherine both died in 1894, she on May 19 and he three months later on August 18; they are buried in St. Sebastian Cemetery.

MY GRANDPARENTS

My grandparents Henry A. Niekamp and Catherine Koch were married on 5 Nov 1878. They made their home on an 80 acre farm that Henry's father had bought on 7 Mar 1876 from John and Mary Benke, this was the E 1/2 of the SE 1/4 of Sec. 3, in Franklin Township, Mercer County. On 10 Mar 1879 Henry and Catherine bought this farm from his parents. Seven children were born to them here. They were members of St.Sebastian Church, where all the children were baptized. On 24 Jun 1897 wife and mother Catherine died, leaving her husband with seven children from one to seventeen years of age. She is buried in St. Sebastian Cemetery. Henry then married Katherine Plasenthal a widow with three children. The Niekamp and Plasenthal children then lived with their parents in the one household on the farm, at least to June 1900 when the U.S. census was taken. In it, all are listed except Katherine's oldest daughter Matilda. It is not known where she was living at the time. She later went to California where she married Frank Cordosa, they made their home on a ranch at La Grange, CA. Her sister Clara also went to California, nothing more is known about her. It is believed both girls were nurses. Their brother Frank married and resided in Cincinnati, Ohio.

Sometime in 1903 after St. Sebastian Church burned down, Precious Blood Parish was established in the village of Chickasaw. A hall had been built several years earlier, which was later converted to a chapel for prayer and an occasional Mass during weekdays only. The folks of Chickasaw were still obliged to attend Mass on Sundays at St. Sebastian. After the fire, Archbishop Elder of Cincinnati granted permission for a church in Chickasaw. The chapel was then enlarged and became Precious Blood Church; it served the people of the village and some of the surrounding rural area. Father Antonius Dick C.PP.S., the first pastor, appointed Henry Niekamp, Joseph Seitz, Gerhard Schroeder and John Will to be the first wardens. From its very beginning the Henry Niekamp family were members of this church. I should mention here that a beautiful brick church was built at St. Sebastian to replace the one that burned down in 1903. Both parishes still exist today.

Henry and Katherine retired from the farm - probably sometime in 1909 and moved to a small farm of five acres at Chickasaw. They were living there in May 1910 when the census was taken; listed are the parents, Henry's son Hugo, and Katherine's daughter Clara. About this same time Henry's son Louis rented the farm from his father; he and his sister Mary were living there at the time of the census in April 1910.

After the family moved to Chickasaw, Henry was involved in the village government; he was elected first to the council, then clerk, and then treasurer, serving in all from 1909 to 1922.

They made their home on this small farm until both died, Katherine at home on 23 Jan 1929, and Henry on 20 April 1929, in a hospital in Dayton, Ohio, after one of his legs had to be amputated because of infection from a wound he suffered to his ankle while climbing a rail fence. Both are buried in Precious Blood Cemetery, Chickasaw.

MY PARENTS

Edward "Ed" Niekamp and Dorothea "Dora" Gieseke, my parents, were married on 26 Nov 1910. In religion Dora was Lutheran and Ed was Catholic when they married. Several years later, after taking instructions from Father Kuenle, Dora converted to the Catholic faith. He gave her a memento card on which he wrote.

In remembrance of your First Holy Communion, received, Nov. 29, 1913, in the Church of the Most Precious Blood, Chickasaw, Ohio. — Charles W. Kuenle, Pastor.

After their marriage they made their home at 46 Main St. in Chickasaw. The house belonged to Dora's Uncle Willie Gieseke, Uncle Willie made his home with them. In January 1913 he decided to go to New Orleans for the Mardi Gras celebration. He only got as far as Montgomery, Alabama where he became ill on the train; he was taken off and put in a hospital where he died. Ed then went to Montgomery to claim his body and accompany it back to New Bremen, Ohio, where burial took place. Ed and Dora then came into possession of the home on Main St.

Ed was a blacksmith. He learned his trade while working for Joe Dorsten, the local blacksmith in Chickasaw. During the time that he served his apprenticeship he lived with Mr. and Mrs. Dorsten whose home was next to the blacksmith shop. At about the same time Ed and Dora were married, he started his own blacksmith shop in Chickasaw. This shop was only a few blocks from their home. Ed served on the village council from Nov 1912 until 1916. Sometime in 1916 they sold the house and the blacksmith shop in Chickasaw.

Ed and Dora with their children Mervin, Arnold and Leona then moved to St. Marys, where Ed worked for a local blacksmith. They lived in St. Marys for only about a year, then moved to New Bremen where they lived with Dora's parents in their home on the "Southend". Their fourth child Vernon was born here on 21 Sep 1917, the only one in the family not born in Mercer County. Ed worked at the handle factory which was located

nearby. In the Spring of 1918 they moved to an apartment in Barth's Flat on North Main Street. This building (demolished in 1983) was located across the street from the Luelleman House, which today is The New Bremen Historic Association Museum. In the Spring of 1919 they moved once again in New Bremen to a house on Walnut Street just north of Second Street. At the time Ed was working for the Auglaize Hoist and Body Company which was only a few blocks from their home.

In the late summer of 1919 they moved back to Mercer County, onto the farm then owned by Dora's uncle Christian Gieseke, the same farm that Dora lived on with her parents for several years from about 1907 to the Fall of 1910, and just across the road from the farm on which she was born. Their children attended the Liberty School located a half mile away to the north. This was the same school that years before Dora and her siblings attended. They now again were members of Precious Blood Catholic Church in Chickasaw, which was two and a half miles distant. Their fifth child Wilmer was born on this farm on 14 Sep 1922.

In the Fall of 1923 the family moved to the Fred Meyer farm in Auglaize County, located at the southeast corner of Clover Four Road and Greenville Road (today State Highway 364). They now belonged to Holy Rosary Parish in St. Marys where they attended church services. Their children now attended the Westside School, located about a mile and a half to the south. They lived on this farm ten years.

In the Fall of 1933 they moved to the Williams farm northwest of St. Marys. In the Fall of 1937 they gave up farming and sold at public auction all their livestock, farm machinery, and chattles. They retired from the farm and moved to St. Marys. Ed worked for several businesses in town and also for a while for the city of St. Marys.

Later on they moved to Marysville, Ohio, where they lived with their son Wilmer and his wife Mary. In 1947 Wilmer drove his car to California accompanied by his parents Ed and Dora. Mary had some health problems at that time, so she remained in Ohio. They stayed for a while with their son Mervin and family in Glendale. Wilmer bought a house at 610 E. Palm Avenue, Burbank. His wife Mary then came from Ohio. Ed and Dora made their home with them. In 1951 Mervin and Catherine bought and moved into a house at 832 E. Providencia Ave. Burbank. A little later that year they bought a lot with two houses on it at 707 E. Providencia Avenue. Ed and Dora then made their home in one of them. For the rest of their lives they lived in this home. Ed worked with his son Mervin in construction until his retirement.

Their children all came to California from Ohio between the years 1935 and 1964. Arnold came first in 1935; Mervin came in 1936; Wilmer and Mary, as mentioned above came 1947; Vernon, Dot and daughter Linda came in 1948; Leona, Bill and sons Bob and Steve came in 1964, their daughter Nancy came in 1962 two years prior to her parents, they made their home in Lompoc. Ed and Dora were thankful and happy, that in the last years of their lives, they could enjoy having all their children and their families live close by. Ed and Dora both died in Burbank, Ed on 13 Feb 1968, and Dora on 3 Feb 1969, both are buried in San Fernando Mission Cemetery.

MY UNCLES AND AUNTS

Anthony "Tony" and Mary Niekamp, resided in Chickasaw for a number of years after they were married. In 1905 he was appointed to the village council and served at least one term. Four sons were born to them there. Sometime after their fourth and youngest son Eugene drowned in a well or cistern the family moved to Minster, Ohio. Two daughters were born to them there.

William "Bill" and Rosa Niekamp, were married in Chickasaw and resided there all their lives. Their home was on the west side of the village just south of the Chickasaw Grain and Milling Company, where he was employed. In later years he was sexton of Precious Blood Church and Cemetery. He served a number of terms on the village council between the years 1912 and 1938. In March 1952 they sold several acres of their land to the Community Athletic Association for the use of the community ball park.

Louis "Lou" Niekamp, stayed on and took over the farm from his father Henry after his father retired and moved to Chickasaw. After Louis and Rose were married, they made their home on this farm until 1923. They then moved one mile east to the Anthony Rentz farm, the birthplace of Rose. They lived on this farm until Louis died in 1962. Rose and her daughter Georgiana then moved into a new home on Mulberry St.

in Chickasaw.

Aunt Mary Niekamp, stayed on and helped her brother Louis on the farm, until his marriage in October 1910. She then went to Dayton, Ohio where she was employed as housekeeper by John H. Patterson founder of The National Cash Register Company in Dayton. In October 1916 Father Menge became pastor of Precious Blood parish in Chickasaw, Ohio, and Aunt Mary became his housekeeper. She remained with Father Menge during his later assignments at Cincinati and St.

Mary Niekamp Marys, Ohio until her death.

Gustave "Gust" Niekamp, served in the army in WWI; after the war he went to Dayton, Ohio. He was employed at Frigidaire. In 1936 he married Gertrude "Gert" Stahl; they lived all their married lives in Dayton. He continued to work for Frigidaire, and after being employed by that firm for more than thirty years, retired from there in Jan. 1959.

Hugo and Leona Niekamp, after their marriage in Cincinati, lived the rest of their lives in Dayton, Ohio. He, like his brother Gust, retired from Frigidaire after being employed there for more than thirty years.









Chapter Three

Koch

Koch Family Komeland

amshurst, Baden, Germany the ancestral home of the BUHLER and KOCH families is an ancient Alemanie settlement. The village is mentioned for the first time in a document dated 21 February 902, when a certain Count Luitfried made a present of some fields to the monastery St. Trudpert in Ettenheim. Gamshurst and some other villages in the neighborhood belonged to the county of the margrave of Baden. In ecclesiastical respects however this region was under the control of the bishop of Strasbourg. When the Margraves had no money they very often pawned the villages to insignificant rulers. Because of these proprietary conditions there were often conflicts and wars.

In the year 1675 the French under Marshal Turenne invaded Baden territory, laid waste to the countryside and destroyed a number of towns and villages including the village of Gamshurst. A monument situated in a park in the neighboring village of Sasbach marks the spot where a fatal bullet ended his career on 27 July 1675.

In the year 1806, Napoleon established the Grand-Duchy of Baden, which existed until the end of World War I. Today Baden and Wurttemberg are combined and a state of the Federal Republic of Germany. Gamshurst is incorporated into, and is a part of Achern.

In earlier times the inhabitants of Gamshurst engaged in agriculture. In years when there were poor harvests, there was great distress and misery—too many people living in too small an area. As a consequence large numbers of the inhabitants emigrated.

In the years 1740-1780 many farm families emigrated to Hungary, later on, about 1830-1860 to North America. The Augustine Buehler and the Wendelin Koch families were in the group of 1830. In the year 1854, about 200 inhabitants of Gamshurst emigrated to North America. It was in this year that Nikolas Buehler/Beeler and his family emigrated to Canada

Today the area has a good mixture of agriculture and industry with a sufficient basis of subsistence for the population.

Roch Family Ancestors in Germany

Wendelin KOCH with his wife Theresia SCHEER and at least five of their surviving children immigrated to the United States from Gamshurst, Baden, Germany. It is recorded in the church records that they left there for America in 1830. I have not found a ship passenger record of their voyage to America.

The Wendelin Koch Family in America

endelin Koch with his wife Theresia Scheer and at least five of their surviving children immigrated to the United States from Gamshurst, Baden, Germany. It is recorded in the church records that they left for America in 1830. It is almost certain that they and the Augustine Buehler family came at the same time and on the same ship; a ship's passenger record would prove this, but to date none has been found.

The family settled in Greenville Township, Darke County, Ohio, where Wendelin died in August of 1832, only a short time after the family arrived there. The Koch and Buehler families lived near each other perhaps on adjacent parcels of land. Both families are listed consecutively on page 10, in the 1840 census. Terissa Cook (Theresia Koch) along with her two sons Nicholas and Ferdinand are all three listed under Head of Family. It is unusual to find more than one person listed as Head of Family. In the 1850 census Theresa Cook (Theresia Koch) is listed as a farmer with real estate valued at \$1200. Her son Nicholas, his wife Mary and infant son Joseph are listed in a separate, nearby household.

Theresia continued to live on the original homestead until her death in January 1864. She and Wendelin are buried in St. Mary's Cemetery, Greenville.

Ferdinand Koch married Maria Anna Buehler on 25 May 1843 (for more information see the Buehler family). It is not known where the young couple made their home after their marriage, perhaps with his mother Theresia.

Sometime in late 1847 or early 1848, the family moved to Marion Township, Mercer County, Ohio where on 10 Nov 1847 Ferdinand bought from Augustus Wattles the W1/2 of the NE1/4 of Sec. 15, containing 80 acres of land. He bought an adjoining 20 acres the E1/2 of NE1/4 of the NW1/4, of Sec. 15 from Leon and Catherine Stelzer on 21 Dec 1867. On 26 Feb 1889 he sold one acre out of the northeast corner of the 80 acre parcel to Carl Lammers.

At this time the Ferdinand Koch family were members of St. John Church, Maria Stein. In 1852 St. Sebastian parish was established and the church was built in the woods, less than a mile north of the Koch home. The Koch family was one of the pioneer families of this parish.

Augustus Wattles with his wife Susan and their four children Sarah, Theodore, Emma and Mary Ann moved to Mound City, Kansas probably about the time he sold the farm to Ferdinand Koch.

^{1.} This farm was probably the farm on which the Wattle's family made their home. Augustus Wattles was of Scotch-Irish decent. He was born 25 Aug 1807 in Connecticut. He was an efficient farmer and well educated school teacher. In 1833 he taught at a school for Negro children in Cincinnati, Ohio. He was convinced that the lot of these people would be better in a rural area as farmers than in the city. In 1835 he brought a group of Negro families from Cincinnati to Mercer county, where they established themselves on farms in the Carthagena area. They built a log schoolhouse where Wattles continued to teach their children. On 24 June 1836, in Cincinnati he married Miss Susan E. Perly a school teacher with whom he had became acquainted when both taught in the same school in that city. She joined her husband and both taught in the school for Negro children at Carthagena. Later this school evolved into the Emlen Institute, and then later on the property was sold to the Society of the Precious Blood, C.P.P.S., and it became St. Charles Seminary.

Ferdinand made out his last will and testament on 4 Feb 1892; he bequeathed to his son Joseph the farm and all his personal property with a provision that Joseph furnish he and his wife Maria Anna the room in the house that they at that time occupied, good board, wood or other fuel, light, etc. and also pay each of them a yearly tribute in money of One Hundred Dollars, during the natural life of either. Joseph was appointed executor of the estate. The daughters (Joseph's sisters) were each to receive a sum of money as specified in Ferdinand's will.

Ferdinand and Maria Anna lived nearly all of their married lives on this farm, where both died, he on 25 Jun 1892 and she on 5 Jul 1894. Both are buried in St. Sebastian Cemetery.

Buebler Family Bomeland

amshurst, Baden, Germany the ancestral home of the BUEHLER and KOCH families is an ancient Alemanie settlement. The village is mentioned for the first time in a document dated 21 February 902, when a certain Count Luitfried made a present of some fields to the monastery St. Trudpert in Ettenheim. Gamshurst and some other villages in the neighborhood belonged to the county of the margrave of Baden. In ecclesiastical respects however this region was under the control of the bishop of Strasbourg. When the Margraves had no money they very often pawned the villages to insignificant rulers. Because of these proprietary conditions there were often conflicts and wars.

In the year 1675 the French under Marshal Turenne invaded Baden territory, laid waste to the countryside and destroyed a number of towns and villages including the village of Gamshurst. A monument situated in a park in the neighboring village of Sasbach marks the spot where a fatal bullet ended his career on 27 July 1675.

In the year 1806, Napoleon established the Grand-Duchy of Baden, which existed until the end of World War I. Today Baden and Wurttemberg are combined and a state of the Federal Republic of Germany. Gamshurst is incorporated into, and is a part of Achern.

In earlier times the inhabitants of Gamshurst engaged in agriculture. In years when there were poor harvests, there was great distress and misery—too many people living in too small an area. As a consequence large numbers of the inhabitants emigrated.

In the years 1740-1780 many farm families emigrated to Hungary, later on, about 1830-1860 to North America. Augustine Buehler and his family were in the group of 1830. Later on in the year 1854, about 200 inhabitants of Gamshurst emigrated to North America. It was in this year that Nikolas Buehler/Beeler and his family emigrated to Canada

Today the area has a good mixture of agriculture and industry with a sufficient basis of subsistence for the population.

Buebler Family Ancestors in Germany

Augustine BUEHLER with his wife Katherina KOCH, and seven children immigrated to the United States from Gamshurst, Baden, Germany. It is recorded in the church records that they left there for America in 1830. I have not found a ship passenger record of their voyage to America.

Mrs. Starrock had already done research for me on my BUEHLER and KOCH families, and while doing research for Mr. Grady found that we were related and shared the same ancestors. She sent Allan my name and address, he then got in touch with me and in May 1980 sent me a copy of his book THE NICHOLAS BEEHLER FAMILY 1680-1980, which he had just published. It is the history of the ancestors and descendants of Nikolaus BUEHLER/BEEHLER, his wife Amalia BRUNNER/PRUNNER and their children who immigrated to Ontario, Canada, in 1854.

Church books of St. Nicolaus Catholic Church, Gamshurst, Baden, Ger., extracted by Genealogist Margaretha Starrock from the original records at the church in Gamshurst. These records have been filmed by the LDS and are in their library in Salt Lake City, Utah.

Mrs. Starrock added a note, that, if no profession is mentioned, all men were day laborer or farmer.

The Augustine Buebler Family in America

I ugustine Buehler, with his wife Katherina and seven children emigrated from Gamshurst, Baden, Germany in 1830, sometime after the birth of their daughter Maria Theresia, who was born on 11 April 1830. Their port of embarkation and port of entry is not known. On their way west their son John was born on 23 August 1832, in Buffalo, New York. How long they remained in Buffalo is not known.

On Oct 16, 1835 Augustine Buhler (Buehler) bought from the United States Government, Andrew Jackson President, two parcels of land in Greenville Township, Darke County, Ohio. Parcel No.1. U.S. Certificate No. 4329, 80 acres in Sec. 19. This Certificate reads Augustine Buhler (Buehler) of Montgomery County, Ohio, therefore the family must have resided there at least part of the time between 1831 and 1835. He sold this parcel on Dec 4, 1852, to John Fetter. This parcel the E1/2 of the SW1/4 of Sec. 19 was probably the Buehler family homestead in Darke County.

Parcel No.2. U.S. Certificate No. 4350, 40 acres in Sec.30. He sold this parcel on Oct 4, 1838, to Joseph Bowman.

This deed is of interest - the Grantors are Augustine Bahler (Buehler) and his wife Katherin Koch Bahler (Buehler), it is the only deed I have found that has Katherin(a)'s maiden name Koch on it.

Augustine bought an additional 80 acres of land in Sec. 19, on 10 Sep 1841, from Thomas M. Wales, He sold the east side of this parcel containing 50 acres, Jul 1, 1847, to John Schaechinger, the west side containing 30 acres, Sep 9, 1847, to Frederick Dahma. He also bought lot No. 28, in the town of North Jacksonville (Versailles), which he sold Aug 19, 1848 to Marcus Patty.

Augustine Buehler became a naturalized citizen of the United States 19 Apr 1838. Two items of interest were found in Darke County, Ohio - COMMON PLEAS COURT RECORDS 1817-1860 Compiled by Anita Short and Ruth Bowers, pg.15, 11-25-1835 - Augustus BEHLER (Augustine BUEHLER), 45 yrs., a native of Baden makes declaration to become citizen. and on pg.23, 4-19-1838 - Naturalization, Gustave BOEHLER (Augustine BUEHLER).

At this time there were no Catholic Churches in the immediate area. In 1838/39 Bishop Purcell dispatched Father Louis Navarron to the area. The first thing Father Navarron did was build a church, St. Valbert's located in the forest between Russia and Versailles. It consisted of two rooms, one for the church and the other for a living room. It was in this small church in the forest, that on 25 May 1843, Father Navarron united in marriage Ferdinand Koch and Maria Anna Buehler, and Raymond Buehler and Veronica Koch.(Veronica was Ferdinand's sister and Maria Anna was Raymond's sister.)

Sometime before 1850 the Buehler family moved to Mercer County, Ohio, they are listed in the 1850 census residing in Marion Township.

Augustine was a farmer by occupation. He apparently enjoyed a second occupation dealing in real estate judging by the number of parcels of land he bought and sold. In addition to those in Darke County, the following is a list of lands Augustine Buehler bought and sold - all in Marion Township, Mercer County.

Jul 10, 1847, Augustine Buhler (Buehler) bought from John Randolph dec'd. (by Wm. Leigh, Atty. in fact), 160 acres in Sec. 11. This was a part of the land that was bought in Mercer county by Judge Leigh who was executor for the estate of John Randolph deceased of Roanoke, VA, to comply with John's wishes as was expressed in his will, that land be bought on which to resettle his manumitted slaves.

On Sep 5, 1851, he sold 40 acres of this, to Henry Hein, and 40 acres, to Blasius Hein. Nov 10, 1852, he sold the remaining 80 acres, to his son Patrick Buehler.

Jan 11, 1849, Augustus Behler (Buehler) bought from Thomas and Mariah Wise 80 acres, in Sec. 13.

Sep 27, 1858, he sold 40 acres, to his son Raymond Buehler, and 40 acres, to John H. Greishop. The parcel sold to Raymond Buehler was the E1/2 of the E1/2 of the NW1/4 of Sec. 13, it was the Raymond Buehler family homestead in Mercer County, it remained in the Buehler family until May 12, 1979, when it was sold by Urban Buehler grandson of Raymond. At the time of this sale the farm consisted of 100 acres, so, at sometime 60 acres were added to the original 40 acres.

Sep 22, 1849, Augustine Buhler (Buehler) bought from Archimedes Berry dec'd. (John Davis Admr.) 55 acres in Sec.15. He sold this parcel to Maximilliam Seitz on 29 Nov 1850.

Jun 18, 1850, Augustin Bahler (Buehler) bought from the Auditor of Mercer County nearly all the lots of Millport the east addition of Chickasaw, there were a total of 63 lots, 4 lots were not included in this sale. Augustin bought these 4 lots on Dec 30, 1850 and Jun 28, 1851.

Jun 18, 1850, Augustin Bahler (Buehler) bought from the Auditor of Mercer County 79.38 acres in Sec. 14. This probably was the Augustine Buehler family homestead in Marion Township. He sold this parcel to Leon Stelzer on Mar 11, 1863. Included in this sale and recorded on the same deed were the 63 lots of Millport, and also lots 4, 5, 6 and 7 in the North Addition of Chickasaw. Augustin had bought these four lots on Jul 16, 1847, Dec 8, 1847 and Aug 2, 1848.

Nov 29, 1850, Augustin Bahler (Buehler) bought from Maximilliam Seitz and Adam Fecker 40 acres in Sec. 12. He sold this parcel to Gerhard Miller on Sep 26, 1851.

Jul 8, 1852, Augustus Beahler (Buehler) bought from Geo. W. and Emily R. Stetwell 80 acres in Sec. 11.

Mar 14, 1854. He sold 40 acres of this, to Joseph Heitzler, and 40 acres, to John Stucke.

In addition to the above land transactions Augustine Buehler bought at least 15 lots scattered throughout Chickasaw between Aug 19, 1848 and Jul 20, 1852. No research was done on when and to whom these lots were sold. Some are documented in the book *Chickasaw*, *Ohio Sesquicentennial 1838-1988*.

While residing in Marion Township the Augustine and Raymond Buehler families were members of St. John parish at Maria Stein, which was established in 1836. The first church was built of logs. Preparations were started in 1847 to build a new church, it was to be of brick construction. In 1848 Raymond Buehler made the bricks on the site of the new church for the sum of \$444.00. Construction began in 1849, and the church was completed in October of 1850.

The Augustine Buehler family moved to Butler Township, Mercer County, OH in 1863, where on Aug 7, 1863 August Buehler bought from Bazil Cecil 80 acres the E1/2 of the NW1/4 of Sec. 11, he sold these 80 acres to his son John on Oct 8, 1875. John had bought an adjoining 70 acres the N1/2 of the NE1/4 of Sec. 11. on May 27, 1865, from Administrators Robinson and Morris.


John Buehler was in the Civil War, he enlisted Sep. 10, 1861, and served in Batt'y M, 1 Reg't Ohio L. Art'y until discharged at Camp Dennison, OH on Dec. 13, 1864

The Buehlers were among the first members of St. Aloysius parish when it was organized in 1865. Prior to it's organization and until the completion of the church, dedicated on June 30, 1878, the members of the parish attended services in the chapel of St. Charles Seminary.

Augustine and Katherina would live out the rest of their lives here on their farm in Butler Township. After a long, active and what must have been a most interesting life both died there in February 1879, and are buried in St, Aloysius Cemetery.



Chapter Five

Stammen Family

Stammen Family Bomeland

The Albert Stammen family came from the village of Kapellen near Geldern, Rhineland, Germany, located on the Lower Rhineland Plain between the Rhine River and the Holland border. The land in this area is flat, and only slightly above sea level. The soil is fertile, most of it is under cultivation; crops grown are grains, sugar beets and various kinds of vegetables and flowers. Geldern is famous for growing high quality asparagus. About 6 miles south of Geldern is Straelen - the flower town. The low-lying areas not suitable for cultivation are left in pastureland on which graze livestock, mainly dairy cattle. Pigs also are raised. The nearby town of Sonsbeck is known for its pig market.

The Lower Rhineland has many beautiful churches and historic places. Several that are close to Kapellen are: Kevelaer, Xanten, and Kalkar.

Kevelaer is located about six miles northwest of Kapellen. it is famous for its Grace Chapel and Chapel Square. After a vision the peddler Hendrick Busman had a small shrine built in 1642, in which is kept the grace picture, a small copper etching with a so-called Luxemburg Mother-of-God. It became a very popular place of pilgrimage. Still today hundreds of thousands of pilgrims come to Kevelaer. In the past century the Pilgrimage Church of St. Maria was built in neo-gothic style. It is a large church that can accommodate several thousand people.

Xanten is located at the Rhine River twelve miles from Geldern via a scenic highway that runs from Geldern, through Kapellen and Sonsbeck. Xanten grew around a Roman fortification, one of fifty built along the Rhine, about 11 BC by the Romans during the reign of Augustus, the first Roman emperor. Xanten Archaeological Park with its reconstruction gives visitors some idea of what a Roman town looked like. Also, in Xanten is St. Victors Cathedral, built on the same site of several earlier churches, one of which according to legend, was founded by St. Helena, the mother of Constantine the Great, to guard the relics of St. Victor, martyr of the Legion of Thebes. In the church and the adjoining museum, are some of the finest artistic treasures, paintings and woodcarvings to be found in the Rhineland.

In Kalkar, located about ten miles northwest of Xanten is the 15th Century Gothic Church of St. Nicholas with it's several beautiful woodcarved altar pieces, carved around 1480-1540 by Master Woodcarvers of the Kalkar School; the one on the high altar contains 208 figures, all carved in minute detail.

Stammen Family Ancestors in Germany

The Albert STAMMEN family came from Kapellen near Geldern, Rhineland, Germany, the village is located about ten miles from Holland. Thus far efforts to find more information, or to trace them further back have not been successful. My great-grandmother Anna Catherine's death certificate states that she was born in Holland. So, it is possible they resided there at that time. What information was found in German records follows.



The Stammen Family in America

The Stammen Family emigrated from Rhineland, Germany, the two older boys in 1849 and the rest of the family in 1850.

Gerhard and Peter John STAMMEN, sons of Albert immigrated to the U.S.A. from Rhineland Ger. on the Ship *Alexander Edmond*, Captain James Mustart, Master. Burden was either 716, 746, or 776 tons; it arrived in New York harbor from Bremen, Ger. on 15 Jun 1849. On board were 273 passengers of which 14 were cabin passengers.

Among the passengers were

John STAMMEN age 30 (Peter John)
Gerhard STAMMEN age 32
Andreas STAMMEN age 43
Anna STAMMEN age 39 - Who were Andreas and Anna? What relation if any? Where did they settle?

All are listed as from Mittelruesselbach, Germany¹

These STAMMENS are also listed in *German Immigrants Lists of Passengers Bound from Bremen to New York 1847-1854*. In this book there is a note on page XIV as follows,

"A note regarding list 737 for the year 1849 must be made. In this list nearly all the passengers were recorded as from Mittelrusselbach, Germany. Undoubtedly many did come from that place, but some might not have, since a large number of the surnames given are not indigenous to that area. As it was not possible to identify exactly which of the immigrants were from Mittelruesselbach and which were not, it was thought best to retain the list as found."

One year later Albert STAMMEN, with his wife Wilhelmina Lucia AENGENHISTER and three children Anna Catherine, John Theodore and Peter Henry immigrated to the U.S.A. from Kapellen, near Geldern, Rhineland, Ger. on the Duty Ship *Maria Elizabeth*, Captain Tonker, Master. They left the Port of Rotterdam, Holland, 30 Apr 1850, and arrived at the Port of New York on 8 Jun 1850. A voyage of 38 days.²

The Stammen family decided that the two older boys would go to America first to see what the conditions were, and to select a locality in which to settle. After landing in New York,

Gerhard and Peter John made their way to Cincinnati, Ohio and then north, probably by way of the Miami Erie Canal to New Bremen or Minster and then to Mercer County, Ohio.

After the parents Albert and Wilhelmina, daughter Anna Catherine, and sons John Theodore and Peter Henry arrived in New York, they went directly to Mercer County. There they joined Gerhard and Peter John who most likely had already selected the land in Marion Township, on which the Stammen family would settle. On 2 Jul 1850 Albert Stammen bought from Rueben P. Graham and his wife Mary Ann 120 acres of land in Marion Township, Mercer County 80 acres in Sec.9 and an adjoining 40 acres in Sec.10. The 40 acres was directly across the road from the Fred Niekamp farm. Somewhere on this land the Stammen family made there first home; it is not known just where the house stood. In the U.S. 1850 census, Marion Township, taken on July 30, all members of the family are listed and all are residing in the same dwelling.

Albert bought several more parcels of land in Marion Township. On 21 Apr 1851 he bought from Joseph A. Quinta and John B. Albin 27 acres in Sections 9 and 10; this land adjoined on the north side the 120 acres he bought on 2 July.

On 12 Sep 1853 he bought from Aquila P. Brown and his wife Sarah 160 acres in Section 9, a part of this land adjoined the 27 acres on the west side.

In 1852 the Catholic families living in the area northwest of Chickasaw attended church services either at St. John or St. Rose the two nearest churches at a distance of 3 to 4 miles. They wanted a church nearer their homes. Adam Gerlach, Albert Stammen, John Will and Herman Schwieterman were sent by their neighbors to confer with the people of Chickasaw about building a church in the vicinity lying just northwest of the village of Chickasaw. Albert Stammen offered to donate five acres of land. The people of Chickasaw turned down this idea.

However, the folks living in the area of what was to become known as St. Sebastian did not give up. On 6 Apr 1853 Albert Stammen and his wife Wilhelmina Lucia deeded to Rt. Rev. John Baptist Purcell, Archbishop of Cincinnati, six acres square out of the northwest corner of the E1/2, of the SE1/4, of Sec. 9. The first church of St. Sebastian was built on this site, in the woods, it was of log or wood frame construction, and measured 40 feet square.

In 1854 or soon thereafter Albert and Wilhelmina divided the rest of their lands and sold them to their sons. Some of the area around the six acre church site was sold piecemeal in small parcels to a number of individuals, some built only a residence, others a business, or a combination of both. This then became the village of St. Sebastian.

John Theodore acquired from his parents all of the W1/2 of the NE1/4 of Section 9, except for a parcel of 3 1/4 acres in the southeast corner; it was also within the village of St. Sebastian and across the road from the church. Albert and Wilhelmina made their home on this parcel until both died, she in 1870 and he in 1873. They are both buried on St.

Sebastian Cemetery. After the parents died, the children inherited this property. In April 1875 the brothers and sister of John Theodore sold their shares to him.

In the year 1878 there was a need for a larger church. A new church was built on the same site. It was 40 by 84 feet, and built of brick. It was dedicated on 10 Oct 1879, and was enlarged in 1895. On 12 Jan 1903 a fire destroyed this church along with all its contents, including the Blessed Sacrament and all parish records. The loss of these fifty years of

records made family research of the Koch, Niekamp and Stammen families very difficult. Some of the dates of the births, deaths and marriages of these three families were obtained from other sources, however some gaps still remain.

In July 1903 after the church burned down, the building of a new church was begun, on a site just north and across St. Sebastian Road from the site of the first and second churches. It was dedicated on 18

September 1904, and is still in use today. It is one of the most beautiful churches in the area. St. Sebastian Cemetery, which was established on the same site and adjacent to the first church, also is still in use today; it is well maintained and cared for.



Chapter Six

Hagenburg Castle

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Giesecke Family Bomeland

The Principality of Schaumberg-Lippe, Germany is the homeland of our Giesecke ancestors. they came from the villages of Altenhagen and Hagenburg which are located about 20 miles west of Hannover.

The area was settled beginning about the year 1220 when from their main seat at Wunstorf the Counts of Roden set up the first of numerous Hagen settlements on the plain between the Buckelberg and the Steinhude Lake, one of these settlements was Altenhagen in 1228. From Altenhagen the settlers advanced farther west and in 1378 laid out a new village, which for the security of the Hagen villages got a fortified building -The Hagenburg. This fortress gave the name to the newly established site. Hagenburg achieved only local significance. It was the fortified place among the Hagen villages and Roden settlements on the shore of the Stinehude Lake.

A tax list for the year 1559 shows the names of taxpayers and the acreage and livestock on which each was taxed. At that time there were at Altenhagen 27 households and at Hagenburg 41. The farms were not very large, at Altenhagen they ranged from 3 to 36 acres for a total of 481 acres, at Hagenburg they were even smaller ranging from 2 acres to 30 acres for a total of 433 acres. Ancestor surnames appearing on this list are at Altenhagen: Auhagen, Hildebrand, Kuckuck and Rust 3 times, and at Hagenburg: Hillebrand (Hildebrand), Rust 5 times, Turnau and Wilhelm.

The church records of St. Nicolai Church begin in 1664, so it is quite impossible to trace family relations before then, however it is most certain that some of these inhabitants listed are ancestors.


A tax register for the year 1685 of Hagenburg-Sachenhagen, lists for the first time, the number of each house/farm. On farm No. 20 is listed Jobst (Jost) Giesecke, Halbmeier. Jobst or Jost probably came into Altenhagen in 1667 when he married Anna Margarete Hildebrand. Farm No. 20 remained in the Giesecke family for at least five succeeding generations. In the population census from the year 1818 (1836 recorded) "Giesecke, Ackersmann" is still listed as owner of farm No. 20. House/farm No. 50 in Hagenburg was the Craas (Kraas) farm. Ancestor Johann Diedrich Conrad Giesecke married onto this farm 1 Jun 1824, when he married, Sophie Elenore Dorothea Craas youngest daughter of Johann Christoph Craas. Several generations of the Craas family lived in Hagenburg. The first one is believed to have been Johann Diederich who came from Grossenheidorn around the year 1685.

A census was taken in the year 1766 of all the inhabitants of Altenhagen and Hagenburg. This census shows the house number, the head of the household and the number of residents residing therein. The following ancestors, or people with ancestral surnames are listed. In Altenhagen: Auhagen, Bremer, Giesecke, Haddendorf, Kuckuck 2 times, Roever, Rust 5 times, Scheele 3 times, Suffrian 2 times, Turnau, and Wilhelm. In Hagenburg: Aughagen, Craas 3 times, Rust 3 times, Scheele, and Suffrian 2 times. At that time there

were in Altenhagen 271 inhabitants in 40 households, and in Hagenburg 604 inhabitants in 96 households. In spite of war and turmoil, which continually troubled the region, of the family names shown in 1559 more than 50% are still mentioned in the 18th century.

The Thirty Years War 1618-48, left the inhabitants of Altenhagen, Hagenburg and the surrounding area very much impoverished. Several farms were destroyed, but mostly they suffered from the loss of livestock and foodstuffs. Military units passing through again and again demanded board and lodging. At Rehburg Commander Decker was quartered. His troops constantly marauded through the lake province. From the Hagenburg district alone they drove away 91 horses, 66 cows, 760 sheep and 15 pigs. Twice between May 2 and July 8, 1634 the Hagenburg district was robbed out completely. In order not to be surprised by hostile troops, the citizens of Hagenburg set up an observation post on the Tienberg near Bokeloh. A bundle of straw was attached to a long pole. As long as this sign was visible, everybody went about their business. The moment the sign was not there anymore, they knew that combatants or marauders were approaching.

St. Nicolai Church in Altenhagen dates back to about the year 1250. The first church set on a little rise, called the "Brinke", in the middle of Altenhagen. In the years 1483-84, a

new church was built. Years later in 1768, Pastor Johann Daniel Merkel wrote: "The church is too small for the local community, it was built only for the inhabitants of Altenhagen. We often think of enlarging it", (apparently this never happened). He then went on to describe the church. It was of gothic style, built of stone with walls 2 feet, 6 inches thick. It was 73 feet, 6 inches long and 23 feet, 6 inches wide and 35 feet high, with a tower 64 feet high. Adjoining the nave of the church on the south side was

the vestry or vestibule, in it was a small altar, and a baptismal font. Here also, the church files and documents were kept. In olden times the floor of this room was used to store the tithe grain. A large part of the church documents were lost in 1626, when Pastor Ludewig Dietrich Wolbrect had the documents transferred to Neustadt Castle on the Ruebenberg. Here the documents fell into the hands of some of Commander Tilly's soldiers. The extant church records date back to 1664. There are a few gaps. This church served the congregation until 1869 when a new church was built. A few years later in 1874 the old one was torn down.


Pastor Ludwig Peitmann, pastor at Altenhagen from 1664 to 1683, set up a new church book in 1664, he left the first few pages blank. Later on he filled some of these pages with short, concise statements about conflagrations at Altenhagen and Hagenburg. Pastor Peitmann's successors also wrote of other conflagrations. Two of these in which ancestor's homes burned will be listed here:

Pastor Peitmann wrote: "On January 24, the day before the Conversion of Paul, in the year 1679, in the cold of winter, six houses burned down. Almost all the people were at the bog collecting peat, so very little could be saved. Lost to the fire were the houses of Auhagen, Fricke, Rakelbusch, Harms(?), Fricke and Siegmund. May God save us from further distress."

Pastor Johann Herrmann Reichart, pastor at Altenhagen from 1695 to 1722, recorded a disastrous fire as follows.

"On May 23, 1702 most of the parish house and four other houses near the church yard were completely burned down. The four houses which burned belonged to Giesecke, Wohlbrecht, Auhagen and the miller Holste. May the Good Father in Heaven protect us in the future from fire and from all evil."

For as long as man has practiced agriculture, he has grown grain. The need to grind this grain into flour was first done by hand between stones. This method was constantly improved upon which eventually resulted in the mill. The natural forces of water and wind were harnessed to turn the mill stones. At Altenhagen a windmill was erected in 1584 as a sovereign's or government mill. In 1620 it was described as the only Windmill in the Hagenburg district. Several of the first known millers who leased the mill were Hennie Juergens, Heinrich Holste and Arend Sternberg, Arend died in Oct 1683. In the spring of 1691 the Hagenburg District, as the representative of the Count's government,

leased the mill for five years to the miller Johann Muegge for an annual lease rental of 60 Talers. On February 11, 1695, the Hagenburg official Philipp Schwartzmeier reported that the miller Johann Muegge had returned to his customers grain which had not been sufficiently ground. Thereupon the government did not renew the lease. In the spring of 1696 miller Johann Cord Holste leased the mill for five years. (Miller Johann Muegge married Marie Scheele 7 Jul 1687. They are my sixth Great-Grandparents.)

I am indebted to Heinrich Munk who did much of the research on my Giesecke and allied ancestors. He is the author of the book 600 Jahre Hagenburg 1378-1978. Most of the foregoing text was made up from excerpts from this book, and were translated from the German to English.

Giesecke Family Ancestors in Germany

Johann Diedrich Conrad GIESECKE with his wife Sophia Elenore Dorothea KRAAS and their seven children emigrated from Hagenburg, Schaumburg-Lippe, Ger. to the U.S.A.. It is recorded in the church records that they left Hagenburg on the 12 Oct 1846.

In Germany the family spelled their name GIESECKE, when they came to the U.S.A., they changed it to GIESEKE, omitting the C.

One son died Sep. 1801, in Satiga (Salatiga) on the island of Java, East Indies. He was a Lieutenant in the Holland army and a Field-Commander. He was not married and left his family an inheritance of 20,000 Talern, his father never got the use of this money, as it took more than two years before it was paid.

^{3.} No thorough search was made for information on the nine children only the following items were found in the church records on several of these children, one daughter Anna Maria died 1754, age 3 weeks; one daughter Sophie Dorothea died 22 Jan 1766, age 10 months and 2 days In a census taken 5 Apr 1786, in Hagenburg/Altenhagen it lists in House/farm No. 20, the Giesecke family members residing there and also three sons Wilhelm and Fridrich, in Holland 5 years, and Hinrich, in Ostindien (East Indies) 8 years. It is quite certain then that it was Hinrich who died Sep 1801, on the island of Java, East Indies. (See note No.1, above)

Johann Diedrich Conrad Gieseke Family in America

ohann Diedrich Conrad Gieseke with his wife Sophia Elenore Dorothea Kraas and their seven children emigrated from Hagenburg, Schaumburg-Lippe, Ger. to the U.S.A. It is recorded in the church records that they left Hagenburg on 12 Oct 1846. A ship's passenger record has not been found.

From their port of entry they made their way to New Bremen, Ohio, where they settled on a farm east of town. They were of the Lutheran Faith and joined the congregation of St. Paul's Lutheran Church. The husband and father Johann Diedrich Conrad died on 29 Jul 1847 of Malaria. This must have been devastating to the wife and children after such a short time in this new land. The children ranged in ages from four to twenty-two years. With the help of the older children the family managed to stay together. On 29 Aug 1848 the eldest daughter Friederike Charlotte Dorothee married Ludwig (Heinrich) Friedrich Kettler.

On 30 Mar 1849 the widow Sophia Dorothea Gieseke married Gerhard Heinrich Roettger, a widower with five children, whose wife Anna Marie died on 25 May 1848 in McLane (Mclean) Township, Shelby County, OH. On 22 Feb 1849 about a week before their marriage one of Gerhard Heinrich's daughters Anna Maria Louise died of consumption, at the same place where her mother died. Another daughter Henriette Louise Charlotte died 30 Apr 1851 at New Bremen.

In the summer of 1849 the terrible cholera epidemic struck the area, and claimed the lives of 150 of the 700 settlers living in the town of New Bremen and the nearby rural area. Two of the Gieseke children, the eldest son Heinrich Conrad Wilhelm and his sister Sophia Dorothee Louise were victims of this epidemic. Because of the many deaths, the undertakers and grave diggers could not take care of all the dead, so with the help of neighbors they were buried right there near the log house - the family home. To mark the site a rail fence was built around the graves.

The family was living in this home on 30 July 1850 when the U.S. census was taken, listed are Henry Retcar (Roettger), his wife Dorothy (Sophia Dorothea) and eight children: three were named Roettger from Henry's first marriage, four were named Gieseke from Dorothy's first marriage, and a child Henry (Heinrich Friedrich) two months old who was the son of Henry and Dorothy. Henry Roettger was appointed Guardian of the four minor Gieseke children on 12 May 1852.

The family homestead was located a mile east of New Bremen on 40 acres of land the NW1/4 of the SW1/4 of Sec. 12. On 4 Feb 1856 Henry Roettger bought from John Kruse 15 acres out of the NE1/4 of the SW1/4 of Sec. 12. This parcel adjoined the family homestead of 40 acres on the east side. On 14 Mar 1856 Henry and Dorothea Roettger sold to William Gieseke (Dorothea's son Fredrich Conrad Wilhelm) these forty acres. A strip of land sixteen and a half feet wide along the south side was set aside for a private road. This road allowed access to the 15 acres that Henry Roettger bought on 4 Feb 1856. At this time Henry, Dorothea and some of the children probably made their home on these 15 acres.

On 25 Sep 1856 they sold these 15 acres to John Kuenzel, and bought 40 acres in Sec. 35, in St. Marys Township. This land was on the canal about two and a half miles north of New Bremen. Henry, Dorothea, and Henry their son age ten were living there at the time




William and Margareta Schierholt Gieseke

of the 1860 census. On 5 Aug 1865 Henry Roettger died. His estate was settled through the Probate Court, and this land was sold. After his death Fredericke Gieseke went to live with her mother to help her on the farm. Fredericke was paid through the court from the Estate of Henry Roettger, deceased, for necessary labor done, 16 weeks and 1 day of farm and house work at \$2.50 per week, for a total of \$40.35.

On 12 Mar 1857 Fredrich Conrad Wilhelm Gieseke married Anna Margareta Schierholt; they made their home in the log house on the family homestead. Their sons Christian Henry and John Fredrick were born in this house.

Desiring to have more land and probably influenced by Margareta's parents, William and Margareta sold the family homestead of 40 acres on the 18 May 1864 to H.W. Sunderman.

On the same day they bought 40 acres of land from George and Elizabeth Brown, and on 11 Jun 1864 an adjoining 40 acres from Joseph and Christina Terbeck, the combined 80 acres was the N1/2 of the SE1/4 of Sec. 2, in Franklin Township, Mercer County. The family then moved onto this land. Three more children were born to them here, Emily who died before age

three, Emma, and William Henry "Willie". All of their children were baptized in St. Paul's Church, New Bremen, to which they continued to belong. Although it was six miles from where they now lived, it was the closest church of their faith.

They were close neighbors to Margareta's parents Johann Christian and Anna Marie Schierholt, and also to her sister's family Johann Heinrich and Maria Blase, and their two children Anna and John Henry. The Gieseke and Blase homes were just across the road from each other. Three years later, on 13 Dec 1866 her sister Maria, Johann Heinrich's wife died of childbed fever, one week after giving birth to a daughter Maria (Mary) who survived. In 1888 she married Henry Carl Dicke. (see the Dicke Family)

After his first wife Maria died, Johann Heinrich Blase, left with three small children under six years of age, married Frederika Gieseke; they had one child Emma. A little more than four years later Frederika died. Johann Heinrich then married Wilhelmina Sophia Gieseke; they had two children Seraphina and Sophia. Both of these wives were sisters to William Gieseke.

When they bought the land in Franklin Township, most of it was still covered with dense forest. Over the years with a lot of hard work they cleared the land and improved the farm with substantial buildings, including another house. The small brick house that was on the property when they bought the place was left standing. The farm was enhanced by a beautiful hedge which they planted on both sides of the driveway and all along the road bordering the property.

Sometime in the late 1870s William bought a parcel of land in Sec.16, in Hopewell Township, Mercer County. It was nearly all wilderness; only a small plot had been cleared on which stood a log cabin in which Indians had lived. It was on this land that their son Christian and his wife Emelie made their home after they were married in 1881. With the help of his father, brothers and his uncle Henry, they cleared away the forest and developed this land into a fine farm; on it they raised seven children, two of their children died young.

Henry Roettger made his home on the farm with his half brother William and family. He was living with them at the time of the 1870 census. He helped them clear the land and make the many improvements on the farm in Franklin Township and also the one in Hopewell Township. Later on Henry moved to Nebraska.

On 28 Aug 1885 William Gieseke bought an additional 20 acres of land in Franklin Township from Catherine B. Schroeder the widow of Frederick Schroeder, who manufactured wooden shoes. This 20 acres adjoined the original 80 acres on the south side.

#### MY GRANDPARENTS

John Frederick Gieseke and Josephine Mathilda Dicke, my grandparents, were married on 11 Nov 1886. They made their home on the farm with John's parents. As there were two houses on the farm, each family had their own house. John, together with his father and brother "Willie" continued farming this land until sometime around 1900.

On 28 Jan 1902, William and Margareta sold the farm to their son William Henry "Willie". The parents had retired from the farm and were living with their daughter Emma and her husband William Hartwig in a house on North Franklin Street in New Bremen. William Hartwig died 3 Jun 1903. William and Margareta continued to live in this home with their daughter Emma until their deaths.

My grandparents John and Josephine lived on the farm with John's brother "Willie". Their children were all born on this farm, and all attended the one room Liberty School a half mile to the north. About 1907 the family moved across the road to the Blase farm. The parents and their six children are all listed as living there in April 1910 when the U.S. census was taken. None of their sons had an interest to continue farming, so the parents decided to leave this farm. On 15 Sep 1910 they sold at public auction their livestock, farm implements, and chattels. It was about this same time that John sold this farm to his brother Christian. The family then moved to a small farm of only a few acres at the south edge of New Bremen - in the family it was always referred to as the "Southend".

On 26 Nov 1910 their daughter Anna Dorothea "Dora" married Edward Joseph Niekamp, they are my parents. To continue this family see the NIEKAMP FAMILY.

#### MY UNCLES AND AUNTS

Lawrence Gieseke, with his cousin Edward Gieseke, John Rentz, a Mr. Eyink, and two more friends whose names are unknown went to Phoenix, Arizona Territory sometime in the summer of 1910 (Arizona the 48th state was admitted to the Union 14 Feb 1912). Lawrence returned home for a visit with family and friends in Chickasaw and New Bremen in the summer of 1912. Lawrence is my godfather, after my baptism on 15 Oct 1912, Lawrence returned to Phoenix accompanied by his brother Benjamin. In June 1913 Lawrence married Clara Ponder in Phoenix, their son William was born there in Aug 1914. In Oct 1915 Lawrence returned to New Bremen with his wife Clara and son William. Their daughter Beulah was born in new Bremen on 31 Jan 1916. Clara did not like it in Ohio, so, soon after Beulah's birth they returned to Phoenix. Sometime later Lawrence and Clara divorced. He married his second wife (her name was Mary last name unknown) she had a daughter named Jane. This marriage also ended in divorce. He married his third wife Thetis Beatty. There were no children from these last two marriages. Lawrence was employed for most of the years he lived in Arizona by the International Harvester Company in their farm machinery department. He was involved in the delivery, setting up and showing the farmers and ranchers how to operate and maintain the machinery. His work took him to the agriculture areas of the state of Arizona and also into northern Mexico. About the year 1940, he and his wife Thetis moved to Visalia, California, here he worked for a farm machinery company in that city until his retirement. Sometime later they moved to Nevada City, California, where they resided until his death in 1968.

Arnold Gieseke went to Phoenix in the summer of 1911 to visit his brother Lawrence, he was accompanied by his Uncle Willie Gieseke. Uncle Willie stayed there only a short time and returned to Ohio. In Phoenix Arnold went to work as foreman of a crew that laid the

first water and sewer lines in that city. He had some knowledge on the operation of a steam powered trenching machine, having helped lay drain tile on the farm in Ohio with a similar machine. He married Elsie Awrey in Phoenix, on 4 Sep 1913. Elsie was born at Hawley, Minnesota. Their daughter Dorothy was born in Phoenix on 22 Jul 1915. In October 1915 Arnold returned to New Bremen with his wife Elsie and daughter Dorothy. Their daughters Marjorie and Evelyn were born in New Bremen. Soon after his return, Arnold went to work for The Streine Tool and Manufacturing Company (later known as Stamco) in New Bremen. He was a machinist and a tool and die maker, a trade in which he excelled. He worked for this company the rest of his life. Arnold loved the outdoors, his hobbies were hunting and fishing. Elsie was a homemaker, she enjoyed her home, children, and grandchildren and lived to enjoy her great grandchildren. She was a quiet, reserved person. Sewing was her hobby, she spent many hours sewing for her family and others. In later years, Elsie made her home with a grandson, Edward Conradi in South Carolina. She lived to be six weeks short of 100 years of age.

It is believed that Arnold with his family and Lawrence with his family, and perhaps Ben too, all returned to New Bremen, from Phoenix on the same train in Oct 1915.

Benjamin "Ben" Gieseke went to Phoenix for the first time, at age fifteen, with his brother Lawrence, in October 1912, when Lawrence returned after a visit to Ohio. Ben stayed in Phoenix only a short while, in December he returned to New Bremen. In the spring and summer of 1914 Ben again went to Phoenix. On this trip he worked for farmers and ranchers as he made his way west. In October 1914 he arrived in Phoenix. It is not known how long he stayed there, he may have returned to New Bremen with his brothers in October of 1915. On 12 Jul 1917 he enlisted in the army and trained at Camp Sherman, Chillicothe, Ohio. He was a mechanic with Battery B, 324 Regiment Heavy Field Artillery, American Expeditionary Forces and took part in the battle of Verdun on the Meuse River in northern France. After the war he returned home to New Bremen for a while and then went back to Phoenix. He was employed there at Bayless Wholesale Grocers and later Western Auto. In Phoenix he married Blanche Spellmire on 25 Sep 1920. In 1932 or 1933, Ben, Blanche and their three children moved to Ocean Park, California where he was employed at Edgemar Dairies.

Milton Gieseke was in the grocery business for many years, while still in school he worked for the Arcade Department Store, New Bremen, Ohio. He was a clerk in the grocery department, and made deliveries in the store's Model T Ford pickup truck. Sometime later perhaps about 1920, he and John Blase opened a grocery and meat market on South Washington Street in New Bremen known as Blase & Gieseke. In 1925 Milton went to Los Angeles, California, where he resided for about a year, there he managed an A & P grocery near downtown Los Angeles. When he returned to New Bremen he went back to the Blase & Gieseke grocery. On 9 Dec 1926 he married Mabel Schwepe. About this same time John Blase retired and Irwin Heinfeld became Milton's partner in the business, it was then known as Heinfeld & Gieseke. After leaving this store Milton and his wife Mabel had a small grocery on North Main Street in New Bremen known as the "Little Store". They also had the store in Lock Two for a number of years, I don't known if this was before or after

the "Little Store". After giving up the grocery business he worked for Theiman Stamping Company, from which he retired several years before his death. He was active in the New Bremen Senior Citizens and the Men's Garden Club. He was walking home from a meeting at the Senior Citizens when he died, in the street, of a heart attack.

Malinda Gieseke graduated from New Bremen High School; after her graduation, she worked as a telephone operator for a number of years at the New Bremen Telephone Company. On 25 May 1922 she married Virgil Horn, after their marriage they made their home in Kossuth, Ohio where he was employed as an auto mechanic. About the time that their daughter Betty was born they moved to New Bremen. Virgil followed his trade of auto mechanic being employed at Huenke's garage, then Rairdon's garage and for a number of years he had his own garage and service station. In later years and until his retirement he was employed at Beatrice Foods, formerly The White Mountain Creamery Co., in New Bremen.

When my brothers, sister, and I were very young, and my parents went out for an evening or afternoon, Aunt Malinda was our baby sitter. At that time we lived in New Bremen, and she would often stop by our home for a visit. For many years Malinda kept in touch with most of her relatives, and recorded in writing much of the families vital information. Also, over the years she saved items of family interest from the area newspapers. She has a number of large scrap books full of these newspaper clippings - a historical treasure. She has always been happy to share her information with me. All this has been a great help to me in compiling this family history. In the source notes, I refer to all the information from her as from - Family records collection of Malinda Gieseke Horn. Thank you Aunt Malinda.








Map of Weser River Valley

## Dicke Family Homeland

The valley of the Weser River between Minden and Nienberg is the homeland of our Dicke ancestors. The Weser River is 292 miles long, it begins at Hannover Muenden from the junction of two already full rivers, the Werra and the Fulda. It first flows through the tree covered limestone mountains of Weserbergland and then, emerging from the Porta Westfalica, it enters the plain at Minden. The Weser then flows in a winding, northerly course through the North German

Plain, past a number of picturesque rural towns and villages to the port city of Bremen, to the harbor at Bremerhaven, and then on to the North Sea.

A few miles north of Minden on the east side of the river are the villages of Windheim, Loh, Gorspen-Vahlsen, Joessen and Lahde; all in Kries Minden-Luebbecke, North Rhine Westphalia. This area was the



home of our first known Dicke ancestors. Joessen was the home of Henrich Dicke who was a schoolteacher there. His father was probably Arnds Dicke. The records of these ancestors

are in the church books of the parishes of Windheim and/or Lahde.

Sometime before 1764, Ernst Heinrich Dicke a great-grandson of Henrich Dicke the schoolteacher, moved north about fifteen miles to Liebenau on the west bank of the Weser, in Kries Nienberg, Hanover. He settled on a farm near the town. In 1764 he married Anna




The Dicke house and barn at Heemsche.

Margarete Hedwig Siemering, Sometime between 1784 and 1787 the family moved to a large farm at Heemsche near the town of Steyerberg, and the village of Schinna.


This area in the Weser River valley is nearly all productive farmland. The chief grain crops grown are rye, wheat, barley,

oats, and corn; other important crops are hay, sugarbeets and potatoes. Partially drained marshlands are used for pastures for domestic animals, chief of which are dairy cows. Also important on each farm is the family orchard and vegetable garden.

The typical farm home of our ancestors in Germany was the house and barn both under one roof, with the house on one end and the barn on the other. Some of these old farm buildings are still in use to this day.

## Letter

Copy of a letter (translated from German) from Pastor Gerhard Kenter who is former minister of Windheim. He has built up his own Genealogical Archives and gave us the following information on 21 May 1984, Reference family research DICKE-MARTEN, clue no. 15.

Dear Mrs. Haffner!

This morning I received your request regards DICKE from Loh. Loh is part of Gorspen-Vahlsen, this former parish belonged churchwise, only partly to Windheim, the other part belonged to parish Lahde. I first looked up my general file there was no original farm DICKE in Loh, only when I looked up my special file I discovered that there was a farm Vahlsing a.k.a. Kleine Engelke which carried the additional name Marten Heinrich DICKE, Heinrich DICKE married onto the farm in 1709, still in the next generation he maintained his name DICKE.

I found the desired ancestor Ernst Heinrich DICKE, who was baptized on 20 Nov. 1743 in Windheim, born in Loh, therefore the parish Gorspen-Vahlsen No. 15. Due to my special file I have now set up the enclosed chart. The line DICKE goes back to Joessen, Heinrich DICKE was baptized there on 30 May 1688, his father was schoolmaster in Joessen. the father of this one was probably Arnds DICKE who had a pew in the church in 1650, he probably started the farm No. 20 in Joessen which therefore got the additional name Arnds. Today a family Nahrwold is owner of this farm.

The ancestor Anna VAHLSING was confirmed in 1674, in Windheim at the age of twelve years, she was therefore born in 1662, on the farm Vahlsing, Joessen No. 16. Her father was Heinrich VAHLSING born 1625, he was buried on 1 Mar 1695, at the age of 70. The present owner of this farm is the Presbyterian Friedrich KOLLE. The father of Jobst Heinrich VAHLSING in Loh No. 15, is Marten VAHLSING. Therefore that farm got the additional name Martens. Today the family HAGEMANN owns that farm, they are affiliated to the church in Lahde. The owner of the farm Mindeman in Loh No. 13, today is called KAISER, he was a mason. KROEMER in Joessen No. 14, comes from the Schaumburg-Lippe and married onto the farm in 1706, the farm was formerly owned by Heinrich YAEGER, therefore still today it carries the additional name Yaeger. The present owner Wilhelm KROEMER was mayor of the former parish of Joessen. He is now the chairman of the church deacon work in Minden and mayor of the town of Petershagen.

I hope that I have given you much pleasure with these twenty dates from the church books of Windheim, which start in 1669.

## Christian Friedrich Wilhelm Dicke in America

hristian Friedrich Wilhelm Dicke immigrated to America when he was about 14 years old, ca 1852. It is not known if he came alone, or perhaps with a relative or friend. I have not found him in any ship passenger list. From his port of entry he made his way to New Bremen, Ohio. The Miami-Erie Canal opened through New Bremen in 1845; it was in its heyday in the 1850s. Christian Wilhelm went to work on the canal, driving horses or

mules that towed the canal boats from the towpath.

On 22 Nov 1859 he married Rebecca
Dorothee
Wrissenberg who immigrated to
America when she was a young girl.
She located first in
New York state and later moved to New
Bremen. They are listed in the 1860 census; he lists his occupation as cooper

(barrel maker). Barrels were the containers of the day. Many products and a large amount of produce was transported in barrels, especially pork. At that time New Bremen had a number of pork processing plants.

Christian Wilhelm became a naturalized citizen of the United States on 25 Sep 1860. Less than a month later on 17 Oct their first child, daughter Anna, was born. It is not known where in New Bremen the family made their home at this time. They were members of St. Paul Lutheran Church, where all of their children were baptized.


During the 1860s Christian Wilhelm bought and sold several lots in New Bremen:

On 20 Mar 1863 he bought all of lot 50 (old 20), which he sold 30 Oct 1863.

On 20 Oct 1863 he bought 145 ft. of the east end of the west half of lot 54 (old 24), which he sold 3 May 1867.

On 10 Jun 1867 he bought all of lot 62 (old 32); he sold the west one half of this lot 10 Aug 1867, and the east one half on 10 Feb 1869.

On 3 May 1867 he bought the west half of lot 61 (old 31) from John F. and Catherine Meyer, located at the southeast corner of First and Main streets. There was a three story hotel on this lot, of wood frame construction, approximately 40 feet wide and 120 feet long; the third story was used for storage. The hotel became known as the Dicke House and catered mainly to travelers and workers on the canal. The family either made their home in the hotel, or in a house on the east one half of lot 62, which

adjoined lot 61 and the hotel on the south side.

The use of the canal started to decline by the mid 1870s because of the railroads coming into the area and improved roads. Along with it, business at the Dicke House also declined. In 1875 Christian Wilhelm lost the hotel; It was sold by the Sheriff of Auglaize County on 11 Mar 1875 to John H. Mesloh. The hotel was later operated by Alex Burquin, he changed the name to Hotel French. It was probably about this time that the porch or deck was added to the front.

In 1877 the Lake Erie & Western Railroad extended its line from St. Marys to New Bremen and Minster; in the same year official operation of the canal was abandoned but continued in some degree through 1900.


After leaving the hotel, Christian Wilhelm and Rebecca with their seven children moved onto a farm in Section 12, Marion Township, Mercer County. They were living on this farm in June 1880 when the census was taken. It is unusual that in this census none of the members of the family are listed by their given names, but only by their initials.

Several of their near neighbors were the families of Blase, Gieseke and Schierholt. These were the "horse and buggy days". The young folks did not go very far from home to do their courting. Anna married Charles Koehn of nearby Chickasaw. Josephine married John F. Gieseke, they are my grandparents. Henry C. married Marie Blase; her mother was Marie Schierholt Blase and a sister to my great-grandmother Anna Margareta Schierholt Gieseke.

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In 1885, Christian Wilhelm and Rebecca, with their four unmarried children moved to a farm in Section 9, Hopewell Township. There these children all married spouses from neighboring or nearby families. William F. married Augusta Schmidt, Julius H. married Mary E. Krogman, Florentine W. married Charles F. Frahm and Alvina J. married George E. Pierstorff.

The family were members of nearby St. John's Lutheran Church. The parents continued to live on this farm until both died, Christian Wilhelm on 7 Mar 1889 and Rebecca on 6 Jan 1899. They are buried in the Buck Cemetery which is located about one mile southeast of the church on the Frahm Pike.

Death of a Well-Known Lady. Mrs. Rebecca Dicke died at home in Hopewell Township on Tuesday of last week after a brief illness of spinal troubles, and was buried on the following Friday morning the funeral taking place from St. John's Lutheran Church. Rev. Wm. Grabamann officiating. The deceased was born in Germany, July 5, 1835, and came to this country when a young girl, first locating in New York State. She afterwards moved to New Bremen, and in 1859, was united in marriage to C. W. Dicke. To this union nine children were born, seven of whom survive her - Anna, Josephine, Florentine, Albina, William, Henry and Julius. She had been a resident of Hopewell Township since 1885, and was highly respected by neighbors and friends. She was a dutiful wife, a kind and loving mother and a friend whom it was a pleasure to know. The community extends its sympathy to the surviving members of the mourning household.



# Schierholt Family

# Schierbolt Family Ihomeland

The region of Wildeshausen, Oldenburg, Germany belongs to the era of what is called the Quartaerzeit era. It is made up of sand, diluvial sand and loam with many granite blocks and gravel out of the Ice Age, which came down from the Scandinavian

Mountains. The ice melted. The Stone Age began. The farmers of the early stone period, the Neolithikums, 4000 to 2000 years B.C., built from the morains of the Ice Age megalith burial tombs. After 2000 B.C. during the Bronze and pre Roman Iron era came the single, or mound burial culture. These two kinds of burial sites are witness of an early habitation of

the general area around Wildeshausen. Today one can still see many of the great stone tombs (Steingrab), and the mound burial fields (Hugelgraberfeld) of which the one at Pestrup is probably the best known, it contains over 500 burial mounds.

Wildeshausen grew out of a prehistoric settlement. The story of the town started with the actions of the Saxony Duke (Sachenherzog) by the name Wittekind about the year 800A.D. Wittekind was very wealthy with land in the region of Lerigau, besides great forests he owned the "weldige hove", a family site with falls,

on the right bank of the Hunte River, immediately before the gates of Wildeshausen. One of the forebears of this Wittekind gave this family site the first name, his name was Wilgald and he named the family site Wilgaldinghus—house of the Wilgald. The name changed from Wilgaldinghus to Wialteshus, Wiholdeshusen, Wialdeshusen,

Wigaldeshusen, Wildeshuasen and in the 16 century Wildeshausen.

Wildeshausen. It was a trade location on the caravan road from Hamburg to Holland, today it is Federal Highway 213. Wildeshausen grew in size and importance. At that time it was surrounded by a wall with guard houses and a moat. This fortification however did not protect the city during the Thirty Years War 1618-1648. Much of the city and surrounding area was destroyed, many



of the inhabitants died, only two of every five houses were left occupied.

In 1700 Wildeshausen through a contract went into the ownership of Hannover. On 15 June 1803 it was ceded to Oldenburg.

Several of the villages near Wildeshausen, are the ancestral homes of the Schierholt and allied families. These families like their forebears since early times all engaged in

agriculture, they were farmers or peasants. On the ship's passenger list the Schierholts are listed as peasants.

At the village of Pestrup there were four full sized farms. Johann Schierholt who came from Holtorf near Colnrade got possession of farm No. 1, in Nov 1710 when he married Anna Gertrud Sander, aka Helmers. This farm had been in the Sander family at least as far back as 1556. It remained in the Schierholt family until sometime after Johann's death in 1742.


Farm No.2, also belonged to a Sander family at least as far back as 1630. In 1669 it was in the Wuebbenhorst family. In Dec 1724 Lueer Mohrmann married Adelheid Wuebbenhorst, Lueer then became owner of this farm, in some records he is listed as Lueer Wuebbenhorst, and in others as Lueer Mohrmann. In December 1750 Johann Schierholt (son of Johann of farm No.1 the first Schierholt at Pestrup) married Imke Catherine Mohrmann daughter of Lueer. Johann then became the owner of farm No.2. Their eldest son Johann Herman (a brother to Johann Heinrich my third great-grandfather and immigrant ancestor) inherited the farm. Johann Herman married twice, first to Catherine Margarete Mueller who died at age 28, second to Catherine Margarethe Borchers. Johann Herman died in 1796. His son Johann Hinrich from his second marriage then inherited the farm. This son Johann Hinrich married in 1816 Margareta Elisabeth Mahlstedt. He died in 1829, his widow then married in 1831 Johann Heinrich Bernhard Bruning. Thus ended the name Schierholt on farm No. 2 at Pestrup.²

It is interesting that in that same year 1831 the Johann Hinrich and Johann Christian Schierholt families decided to emigrate to America.

In the village of Duengstrup there were eight farms. Farm No.2 belonged to the Hespe family from which Anna Marie, wife of Johann Christian Schierholt descended. This farm was in the Hespe family continuously from 1529 to at least 1914.²

# Schierholt Family Ancestors in Germany

Johann Hinrich SCHIERHOLT and his wife Gesche Margarethe SUBE; their son Johann Christian SCHIERHOLT and his wife Anna Marie HESPE; with their two sons John Henry and Herman; and a Maria SCHIERHOLT age 26, who I believe is a sister to Johann Christian, emigrated from the area of Wildeshausen, Oldenberg, Ger., it is recorded in the church records that they left for America in 1831. They left the Port of Bremen, sometime in the spring of 1835, on the ship *Virginia*, and arrived at the Port of New York on 6 July 1835. Where they lived in Germany for the three or more years 1831-1835 is not known.

He married second in 1786 Catharine Margarethe Borchers, dau. of Hinrich Borchers. Johann Hermann died in 1796 at age 37 years.

4. Johann Schierholt, aka Helmers, son of Dierk Schierholt from Holtorf-Colnrade is the first known Schierholt at Pestrup. He married 1) on the 25 Nov 1710, Anna Gertrud Sander aka Helmers from whom he got his aka Helmers, as the farm probably went with it. Anna Gertrud died 30 May 1714. It was the custom in this area of Northwest Germany, that the eldest son inherited the farm, if there were no male heirs and the farm was inherited by a daughter, when she married her husband would then be known by her surname - the name of the farm. Both names stand side by side, and are usally recorded in the church books upon the occasion of their marriage. This would also apply to a widow who inherited a farm upon the death of her husband, when she married again, as was the case when Johann Schierholt married Anna Gertrud Sander aka Helmers.

## Schierholt Family in America

The Johann Hinrich and Johann Christian Schierholt families arrived at the harbor of New York City on the ship *Virginia* 6 July 1835. From there they made their way to Mercer County, Ohio. Two of Johann Christians brothers Ahrend Heinrich and Herman Heinrich also came to America and to Mercer County, they settled in St. Marys Township. It is not known if they came before or after the rest of the family.

On 14 Nov 1835 Johann Christian Schierholt bought from the State of Ohio, Robert Lucas governor, 40 acres of land, the SW1/4 of the SE1/4 in Sec. 1, Franklin Township for the sum of \$50.00. On this land in the forest the family established their home. Their first house and barn were built of logs from trees on the land. Johann Christian added to this parcel an adjoining 40 acres on the west and 10 acres on the east, making it a farm with a total of 90 acres. Over the years the land was cleared and substantial improvements made, the log buildings were replaced by a beautiful two story frame house and a large barn.

The Schierholt families were among the first German settlers in the area. When Auglaize County was formed in 1848, from parts of Mercer, Wan Wert, Allen, Shelby and Darke Counties, the Schierholt farm remained in Mercer County.

Their daughter Anna Margareta, my great grandmother was born on this farm, she is the only one of my great-grandmothers born in America. The Schierholts were members of St. Paul's Lutheran Church in New Bremen, from the time they arrived in the area.

On the 21 Sep 1891 the heirs of Johann Christian, namely his daughter Anna Margareta Gieseke and his grandchildren, the children of his deceased daughter Maria Blase: Anna Fiehlman, John Henry Blase and Maria Dicke, sold to John Dietrich Schierholt son of Johann Christian their right and interest to the 90 acre farm.

On 19 Aug 1871 Johan Dietrich bought from Henry Blase 20 acres of land, it adjoined the 90 acre farm on the west. On 21 Jul 1911 Johan Dietrich sold this 110 acre farm to his son Franklin.

On 1 Jun 1931 Jacob S. King administrator of the estate of the deceased Franklin and Emma Schierholt sold the 110 acre farm to Frederick Luebkeman.

## Wrissenberg Family Homeland

he Wrissenberg ancestral homeland is the rural village of Engeln and several nearby villages in the district of Hoya, County of Diepholz, located about 20 to 25 miles south of Bremen, Germany. To the east and close by Engeln is the small village of Wrissenberg, According to historical records Wrissenberg as a place name was first documented in the year 1347, when a family by the name of von Klencken chose not to exercise their right of ownership of the - Meierhof zu Wrissenberg - (a dairy farm), rather they chose to give it to the Heiligenberg Monastery. Years later about 1535 following the breaking-up of the order, the rights of the land were given to the reigning power. The mayor of the community of Scholen, in the district of the county of Hoya, expressed the following opinion in a written form in 1959. "The area known as Wrissenberg

belongs to the municipality of Scholen. Wrissenberg consists of three manors, with various houses for the farmhands. It is about 150 hectars large (375 acres)."

Wrissenberg appears as the name of a family for the first time in the church records of Vilsen in 1655. The church in Vilsen is where the families worshiped and all church events

took place, and vital records kept

A few miles south of Engeln is the village of Asendorf where the Schmidt ancestors resided. their vital records are in St. Marcelles church, Asendorf. To the north of Engeln is the village of Wachendorf. It is not known if there is a connection, or

relation between the name of this village and our Wachendorf ancestors.

In 1961 Herman Wilhelm Wrissenberg, fourth great-grandson of Friedrich Wrissenberg/Bolte applied for and was granted a Wrissenberg Coat of Arms for himself and all of his offspring of the male line, - as well as for all living male descendants of the aforementioned Friedrich Wrissenberg/Bolte.



# WIRISSENBERG

#### THE WRISSENBERG COAT OF ARMS

There are three golden hills in a field of blue. Above the hills is a Triple-jointed beam, above which are two gold stars. Atop the blue and gold embellished casque are two golden wings.

#### MEANING OF THE COAT OF ARMS

Three hills rise from the base of the shield, indicating the Wrissenberg foothills, which extend before the Heiligenberg monastery of the Praemonstraten monks. The forebears of this coat of arms were dependent upon the Wrissenberg foothills up until the dissolution of the monastery in 1535. Following their departure, they became known as "the ones from Wrissenberg". The two golden wings signify their newly

chosen seat of Engeln. ("Engeln" - here - the name of a town - means "angels" in German, which explains why this particular symbol was chosen).


Above the rising triplet of hills. a triple-jointed beam crosses the shield diagonally. It represents the first letter of the lineage, "W", as well as the ancestral trade of carpentry. Above the notches in the broken bar are two gold stars, which symbolize further ascent of the family.

# Wrissenberg Family Descendants in America

(15) WR1000- Rebecca Dorothee WRISSENBERG is my great-grandmother and immigrant ancestor. Her descendants are from her marriage to Christian Friedrich Wilhelm DICKE (14) DI1000, see the DICKE FAMILY.

According to family legend she came to the United States when a young girl, settled first in New York state, then later in New Bremen, Ohio.

Rebecca Dorothee's older sister Anna Margarethe married in 1849 at Imsum, Gerhard Conrad REICHERS/RICHERS from Dingen, the marriage is recorded in the church book at Vilsen. The villages of Dingen and Imsum are close to and just north of Bremerhaven, Ger.

The family is recorded in the 1860 United States census taken on July 11, in New Bremen, OH, Page 123, Dwelling 938, Family 899. as follows,

Conrad Riechers, age 47, carpenter, born Hannover

Margaret, age 36, born Hannover

Juliann, age 13, born Hannover

Frederick, age 7, born Hannover

William, age 2 months, born Ohio

This would indicate that Gerhard Conrad was a widower with a daughter Juliann two years of age when he married Anna Margarethe in 1849. Their son Frederick was born 1853, in Hannover, son William was born May 1860, in Ohio, so, they immigrated sometime between 1853 and 1860.
